When ingested Methanol acts as a narcotic/neurotoxin and may cause mild inebriation and subsequent drowsiness, headache, weakness, vertigo, and violent pain in the back, abdomen and extremities. Effects on the eye may include blurred or dimmed vision, eye pain, partial blindness or permanent blindness may occur. Ingestion of Methanol may be fatal. Methanol poisoning may cause degenerative damage to the kidneys, liver, heart and other organs due to metabolic acidosis.

Effects include: Drowsiness, nausea, headache, dizziness and loss of consciousness.

Engineering Controls:

Local exhaust ventilation is recommended. Vapors are heavier than air and will build-up in confined spaces without ventilation. Vapor build-up can be life

Methanol has poor warning properties and will result in a shortened organic vapor canister service life.

A supplied air respirator (SCBA) is required if the capabilities of a chemical cartridge respirator are exceeded.

Skin Protection: PVA supported polyvinyl alcohol, nitrile or viton gloves are recommended.

Natural rubber or butyl rubber gloves should not be worn. Eye Protection: At minimum, safety glasses with side shields should be worn where exposure to

excessive dust or spray is likely.
